Contemporary Celts

Inter-links

A number of *Cumann* Members attended a meeting held at the Celtic Club, (12 Aug) to protest the axing of the Irish, Scottish and Welsh Language programs by SBS Radio. Approx forty five people attended the meeting chaired by Mr Brian Shanahan, President of *Celtic Nations Inc*—organisers of the meeting and also President of the *Celtic Club*—which provided the venue (free-of-charge). Mr Bill Schrank, Secretary of *Celtic Nations* was the Chronicler.

[*Celtic Nations* is an incorporated body initially formed to lobby for the inclusion of a Celtic presence in 2001 Federation Centenary Events.]

Diminishing Frequencies

The *Celtic Nations Committee* convened the meeting to gauge community reaction to SBS' "reschedulings" allegedly based on the 2001 census figures relating to frequency of languages spoken in households (ref. lift-out figs); the fact that many Celts are bi-lingual; plus technical stuff about radio frequencies, economic jargon, newer/needier arrivals and wider audiences. The meeting was also called because, as Brian Shanahan said, "... there is strength and wisdom in numbers; our Government (Federal) is not recognizing the special needs of the wider Celtic Communities... and it's up to each one of us to heighten their awareness".

Professional Presenters of the axed radio programs spoke of their personal efforts to maintain the Celtic languages programs. The current 3ZZZ *Glór na nGael*, honorary co-ordinator, and ex SBS presenter, **Mr Eugene Ó'Rourke** also spoke as did speakers from other interested voluntary groups, including *Cumann Gaeilge na hAstráile* members who sent many (unanswered) letters to SBS during 2003.

Mr Doug McLaughlin, Honorary *Cathaoirleach*/Chair *Scots Victoria*, summed it up when he quoted from SBS' Charter about their programs being "based on language not nationality and guided by the size of that community". He also elaborated on current multicultural policies; pluralism, the perceived lack of SBS community consultation; the exclusion of larger groups, and political agendas.

Wired-up

After a brief discussion, strategies were sought from the floor. The outcome was a resolution to launch a concentrated letter-writing campaign to our Fed. Gov. Reps. with the aim of getting the language programs rescheduled. To this end, an independent, Steering Committee was formed under the umbrella of, but separate from Celtic Nations Inc. (Report next ed.) (FB)

[Is comhlacht corpraithe é an CNC, a bunaíodh ar dtús chun chás na gCeilteach a chur ós comhair coiste na Féile Chéad Bliain Comhlathas na hAstráile sa bhliain 2001].

Briseadh na dTonn (aeir)

Tionóladh an cruinniú chun meastachán a dhéanamh ar chonas mar a chuaigh an scéala don phobal go raibh deireadh leis na dteangacha Ceilteacha ar SBS. Labhair cuid de iarléiritheoirí na gclár SBS ar na hiar-rachtaí a thugadar gan toradh ar bith chun na gclár a choimeád ar an aer agus labhair roinnt daoine eile, ó Raidió 3ZZZ agus ó Chumann Gaeilge na hAstráile, i gcoinne an bheart mharfach a bhí déanta ag SBS.

Dúirt Doug MacLachlan, Cathaoirleach Oinigh, Cumann na nAlbanach Victoria, nach raibh SBS ag feidhmiú de réir a Chairt féin mar go raibh sé de dhualgas ar an stáisiún aire a thabhairt de réir na teanga atá á labhairt ag grúpa áirithe agus ní amháin de réir a náisiúntachta.

Labhair Brian Shanahan tar éis sin chun na píontaí go léir a achoimriú agus dúirt sé go raibh na fírinne sa tseanfhocail sin, 'Ní neart go chur le chéile', agus go gcaitheadar (na Ceiltigh) seasamh le chéile agus a míshástacht a chur in iúl don Rialtas.

Réidh chun Troda

Sé an toradh ba thabhairt a bhí ar an oíche ná gur bunaíodh coiste speisialta faoi scáth an CNC, chun feachtais ghearáin a stiúriú agus an bhrú a chur ar na poiliteoirí trí neart litreacha a sheoladh chucu. (*Teangaire/C.Ö.M.*)

Cúlra Clár SBS

Cuireadh deireadh le Clár na Gaeilge ar Raidió SBS i mí an Mheithimh i mbliana. Tháinig an clár i dtír i 1981 tar éis do phobal na Gaeilge feachtas a chur ar siúl chun clár a fháil dóibh féin. Uair a chloig sa mhí a bhí acu ar dtús. Ach de bharr dian-iarrachtaí an phobail Éireannaigh agus leathnú na séirbhíse raidió sna nochtóidí, tugadh uair a chloig in aghaidh na seachtaine do Chlár na Gaeilge ar an ngréasán náisiúnta. Craoladh an clár ó Sydney agus ó Melbourne.

I measc na ndaoine a chuir an clár i láthair thar na blianta bhí Eibhlín Ní Bheaglaigh, Muiris Ó Scanláin, Louis de Paor, Pádraig Seoighe agus Colin Ryan. Cuireadh na céadta aoi faoi agallamh ar an gclár: Máiréad Mí Mhaoileoin, Roddy Doyle, Paul Brady, Séamus Heaney, Liam Ó Maonlaí agus eile. Ba nasc rí-thábhachtach an clár do phobal na Gaeilge sa tír seo agus in Éirinn agus airíonn muid uainn go mór é. (PK)

SBS –Background

The Irish Language program on SBS Radio was axed in June this year.

The Program began in 1981 after the Irish community launched a campaign in order to secure some airtime for the Irish language. At first the program went to air one hour a month.

However, due to the further efforts of the Irish community in Australia and the broadening of the services offered by SBS in the nineties, the program was eventually given one hour a week on the national grid. It was broadcast from both Sydney and Melbourne.

Amongst the more recent people who presented the program were Eileen Begley, Mossie Scanlan, Louis de Paor, Pádraig Seoighe, Colin Ryan and Paula Kehoe. Hundreds of guests were interviewed on the program over the years: Máiréad Ní Mhaoileoin (Altan?), Roddy Doyle, Paul Brady, Séamus Heaney, Shane Howard, Liam Ó Maonlaí and many more.

The Program was a crucial link between the Irish language community in Australia and in Ireland, and it is sadly missed. (PK)

Thosaigh Daonscoil na Mumhan Dé Satharn, 16ú Lúnasa, i gColáiste na Rinne, i Rinn ó gCuanach, Co. Phort Láirge. Thiomáin Nollaig Ó Donnabháin mé ann ó Cathair Chorcaí. Sul ar chláraíomar i gcóir na Daonscoile d'fhéachamar ar an dara leath de'n chluiche ath-uair idir Loch Garmáin agus Corcaigh. Bhí an t-íomáiníocht go hiontach idir an dhá fhoireann ach bhí an bua ag Corcaigh, 3-17 v 2-07 agus beidh siad ag imirt i gcoinne Cill Coinnigh i gcluiche ceannais sínsearach na hÉireann ar an 14ú Meán Fómhair, ach, mo léan, beidh mé ar ais san Austráil an uair sin.

Tá seasca scoláirí ar an nDaonscoil agus beidh trioca eile ag teacht isteach i gcóir na léachtaí. Tá an chuid is mó díobh in a gcónaí ins an Coláiste é féin. Tá an t-ádh liom nach bhfuil mé ann mar is coláiste i gcóir páistí atá ann agus níl na leapacha mór a dhóthain dom. (Chuala mé go raibh na leapacha níos fearr anois ná mar a bhídís.). Tá mé san Teach Liath. Tá mé i seomra a seacht. Tá an teach leath míle ó'n gcoláiste le slí an bhóthair ach is féidir liom an aicearra treasna na bpáirceanna a shiúil i gceithre nóiméad. Tá mo ghaeilge ag éirí níos líofa mar tá orm é a úsáid de shíor. Níl an Béarla inghlactha sa coláiste. Bhuail mé le Nóirín a thagann go dtí an Daonscoil i Melbourne. Tá sí lán de spraoi mar ba ghnáth agus bearta aici i gcóir na hamhránaíochta.

'Sé an téama atá ag an Daonscoil ná: Éire agus Bunreacht na hEorpa Cá bhfuil ár dtriall? Thug an tAthair Micheál Mag Reill SJ léacht ana suimiúil dúinn ar an gcéad oíche. Ní maith leis in aon cor an iarracht atá déanta amach chun bunreacht nua d'fháil d'Éirinn. Ní bheidh aon neamhspleáchas ag Éirinn. Beidh sí mar stát i Stáit Aontaithe na hEorpa. Ag an uair atá ann faoi láthair féin tá barr ar cúirteanna na hEorpa ar chúirteanna Éireann. Fuair gach duine cóip de Bunreacht na hEorpa. Níl ann ach dréacht.

Bíonn an bricfeasta ar a 9.00 agus bíonn an tAifreann roimhe sin ar 8.30. Bíonn suas le seasca ar an Aifreann gach lá agus canann siad iomainn agus roinnt eile den Aifreann. Bíonn leite agus friochadh againn i gcóir an bhricfeasta. De réir an chláir-ama bíonn rang againn ar 9.30 agus ceann eile ar 10.00. Ní thosaíonn siad ar an am cheart in aon chor. Bíonn rogha againn don chéad rang - Rang Gaeilge nó Amhráin agus don dara rang Filíocht nó Rang Gaeilge. Bíonn léacht againn ar 11.00. Deardaoin beidh léach againn ar Chóras Eorpach - Cás na nIascairí agus Dé hAoine Cearta Teanga agus Cultur san Eoraip Nua. Go dtí sin is ar an bunreacht nua atá siad go léir. Dúradar nach mbeidh téama acu an bhliain seo chugainn.

Beidh Aifreann na Daonscoile agus Bord Quiz againn tráthnóna an Chéadaoin agus Ceolchoirm in onóir do Niocolás Toibín ar an Deardaoin. Bíonn céilí againn leis na rinncí céilí gach tráthnóna ar 9.30. Bíonn Airneán againn gach oíche sa chistin ó 11 go dtí 12 le chupán tae. Glaothlann bean a' tige ar dhaoine chun amhrán nó rud eile a chasadh.

Dé Mairt ar an Airneán thug Andrias ana chuntas dúinn ar *Lugha Lámh Airgid* a bhí in Éirinn 1800 bliain roimh *Chríost*. Bhain sé úsáid as a ríomhaire beag agus Power Pack(?) atá ag Microsoft. Sampla dá stíl: Thaispeáin sé pictúir dúinn de *Balor, rí na Fomóraigh*. Bhí súil aige i lár a éadain. D'fhéach sé síos orainn, "Tá sé ag féachaint anois ar Bhreandán", dúirt sé. Brúgh sé cnaipe ar an ríomhaire. Las an súil. D'fhéach sé arís. "Tá Breandán i láthair fós" adúirt sé "níl laser *Balor* ag obair go ceart".

Deardaoin go hiontach. Ceolchoirm í 'in onóir do *Níochás Toibín'*, fear ó'n áit seo a d'éag le déanaí. Amhránaí a b'ea é. Tháinig na daoine áitiúla isteach. Chonacamar video ar dtús agus chan sé roinnt amhráin dúinn ar an video. Ansin chas na daoine ó'n Rinn amhráin. Ceann díbh a b'ea iníon dó. Chan Áine Ní Foghlua agus Cáit Mulqueen (?) freisin. Sa deireadh bhí na daoine a tháinig isteach agus daoine an choláiste ag canadh le chéile. Tá ana chuid amhráin ar eolas acu agus iad go léir as Gaeilge.

Tá mé ag baint ana sult as an seachtain. Tá na daoine fíor chairdiúil agus is iontach bheith in áit ina bhfuil gach duine ag labhairt Gaeilge

Munster Summer School

Rev Micheal O' Sullivan

Rev Micheál Ó Súilleabháin attended Daonscoil na Mumhan and wrote about it. We are grateful for his permission to publish it here.

Sunday 24 August 2003

Dear Friends

Daonscoil na Mumhan began on Saturday, August 16th in Ring College, Co Waterford. Nollag Ó Donnabháin drove me there and prior to registration we watched the second half of the replayed hurling game between Cork and Wexford. The hurling was wonderful and Cork won: 3.17 v 2.07 and they will now play Kilkenny in the All-Ireland senior hurling final on the 14th September, but alas, I will be back in Australia by then.

There are 60 scholars at the Daonscoil and another 30 will come in for the lectures. Most are living in the College itself. I am fortunate not to be there as the College generally caters for children and the beds are small. I am in Room 7 in the Grey House, which is half a mile from the College, but by taking the shortcut, is only a four minute walk through the fields.

I am becoming more fluent in Irish as I have to speak it constantly. English is not acceptable in the College. I met Noirin, who comes to the Daonscoil in Melbourne. She is full of fun and as usual has plans for the singing.

The theme of the Daonscoil is: *Ireland and the European Constitution. Where are we heading?* Fr Micheál Mac Greil SJ delivered a very interesting lecture on the opening night. He doesn't approve of the effort that has been made to get a new constitution for Ireland. Ireland will not have independence and will be a state within the United States of Europe. At present European courts have supremacy over Irish courts. Each person received a draft copy of the *Constitution of Europe*.

Breakfast is at 9am, with Mass beforehand at 8.30. Up to 60 attend Mass each day and they sing the hymns and parts of the Mass. We have porridge and a fry for breakfast. According to the timetable we have class at 9.30 and another at 10am. They don't begin on time at all! We have a choice – Irish class or Singing for the first one and Poetry or Irish class for the second. At 11am we have a lecture. On Thursday the lecture will be on the *European System – the Fishermen's Case* and on Friday on *Language and Cultural Rights in the New Europe*. So far all the lectures are based on the new Constitution. Next year they won't have a theme. The Mass of the Daonscoil and the Quiz will be held on Wednesday evening and a concert in honour of Nioclás Tóibín on Thursday.

At 9.30 each evening we have a céili and from 11-12 midnight a social evening in the kitchen with a cup of tea. The "woman/man of the house" calls on people to sing or do a party piece. On Tuesday Andrias gave us an account, by using a computer and Microsoft Power Pack, of *Lugh Lámh Airgid* who was in Ireland 1800 years before Christ. The concert, attended by the local people was in honour of Nioclás Tóibín, a local singer, recently deceased. We watched a video in which he sang some songs. Among the Ring people who sang was his daughter, also Áine Foley and Cáit Mulqueen. In the end everyone sang. They have many songs and all in Irish.

I am enjoying the week very much. The people are friendly and it's wonderful to be in a place where everyone is speaking Irish. (Intrp.JM)
