Ag dul i bhfeabhas atá an Scoil Gheimhridh a bhí ar siúl i Sydney ar deireadh seachtaine 9-12 Meitheamh. Bhí méadú ar an líon daoine a d'fhreastail ar an scoil i mbliana le scoláirí ag teacht ó bheagnach gach stáit.

Bhí sceitimíni ar na heagraithe nuair a chinn Glór na nGael ar fheidhmeannach a sheoladh amach ó Éirinn chun bheith páirteach ann. Labhair Daragh Ó Tuama faoi obair Ghlor na nGael agus go h-áirithe faoin Chomórtas Domhanda a cuireadh ar bun anuraidh. Chuir sé in iúl gur pobal mór amháin teanga pobal na Gaeilge, cibé áit ina bhfuilimid ar domhan.
